

INSTRUCTIONS: SIDE SUPPORT POLE

Congratulations on the purchase of your BITEHARDER® Side Support Pole. This product is manufactured with the highest quality components and assembled with pride in the U.S.A.

This product is designed as a temporary device to hold your snowmobile on its side. The BITEHARDER® Side Support Pole is designed for use as a single unit. The use of multiple side support poles is not required or recommended.

Your Side Support Pole **should** be used for:

- Sharpening or replacing your carbide runners
- Sharpening or repairing your carbide studs
- Adjusting your suspension components
- Inspecting the underside of your snowmobile (track, skis, etc.)

Your Side Support Pole **should not** be used for performing major service like:

- Replacing suspension components
- Replacing your skis
- Replacing your track

The BITEHARDER® Side Support Pole has a universal handlebar mount that is designed to fit against your handlebar steering post, handlebar steering cross post, handlebar riser, or directly to your handlebar.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Loosen clamp and adjust pole to desired length. Adjust tension knob (and re-tighten clamp) with enough force to lock pole securely and support the weight of your snowmobile (**Figure 1**).
2. Assure pole is securely positioned to your snowmobile's handlebar steering post, handlebar steering cross post, handlebar riser, or directly to your handlebar.
3. Tip your snowmobile against the Side Support Pole with the pole in a vertical position (**Figure 2**). Optional snow basket is recommended for use in packed snow conditions.

CAUTION: Before releasing your snowmobile against the Side Support Pole, make sure the following conditions are met:

- The handlebar mount is securely positioned
- The Side Support Pole is set to the proper length to hold your snowmobile from tipping back over
- The clamp tension knob is adjusted with enough force so that when clamped, the inner and outer poles are secured from moving
- The Side Support Pole is in a vertical orientation and not at an angle
- The surface the pole is resting on will not allow the pole to slip causing the snowmobile to roll over
